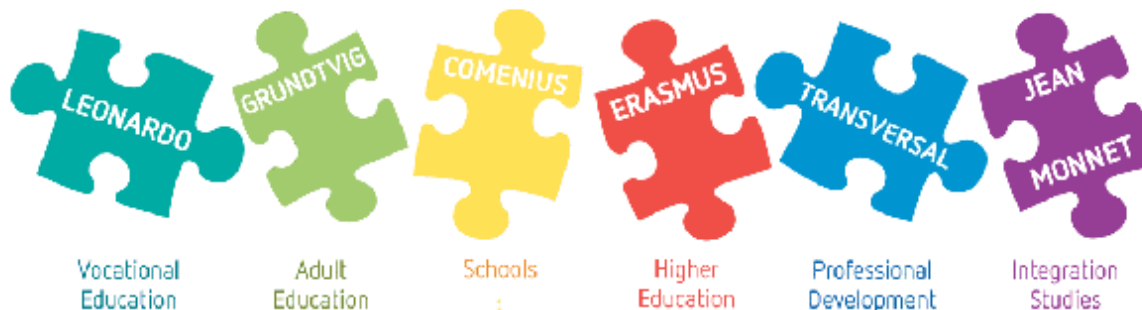

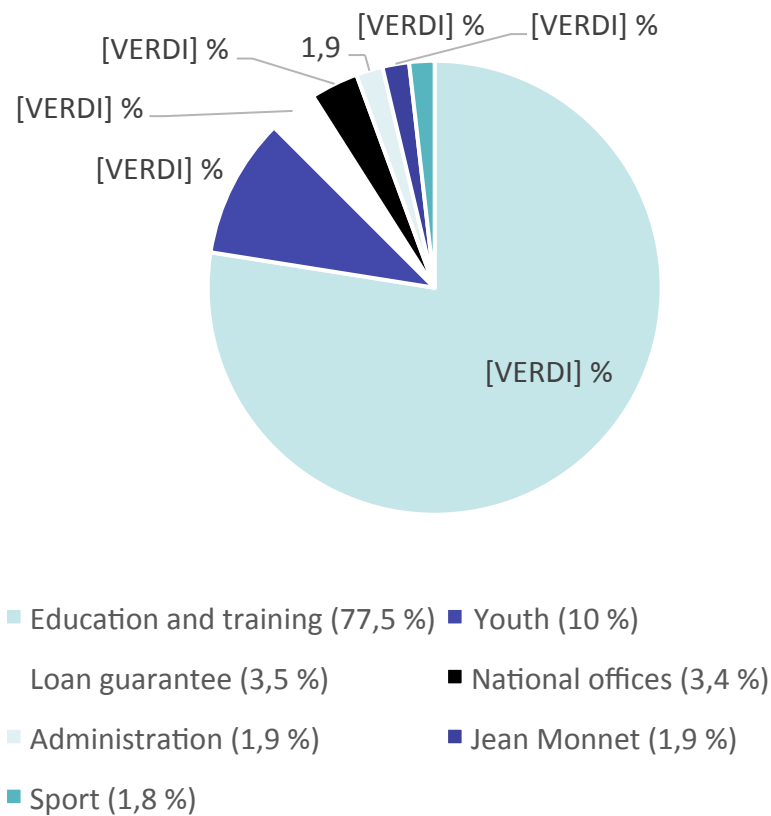

Erasmus + Budget



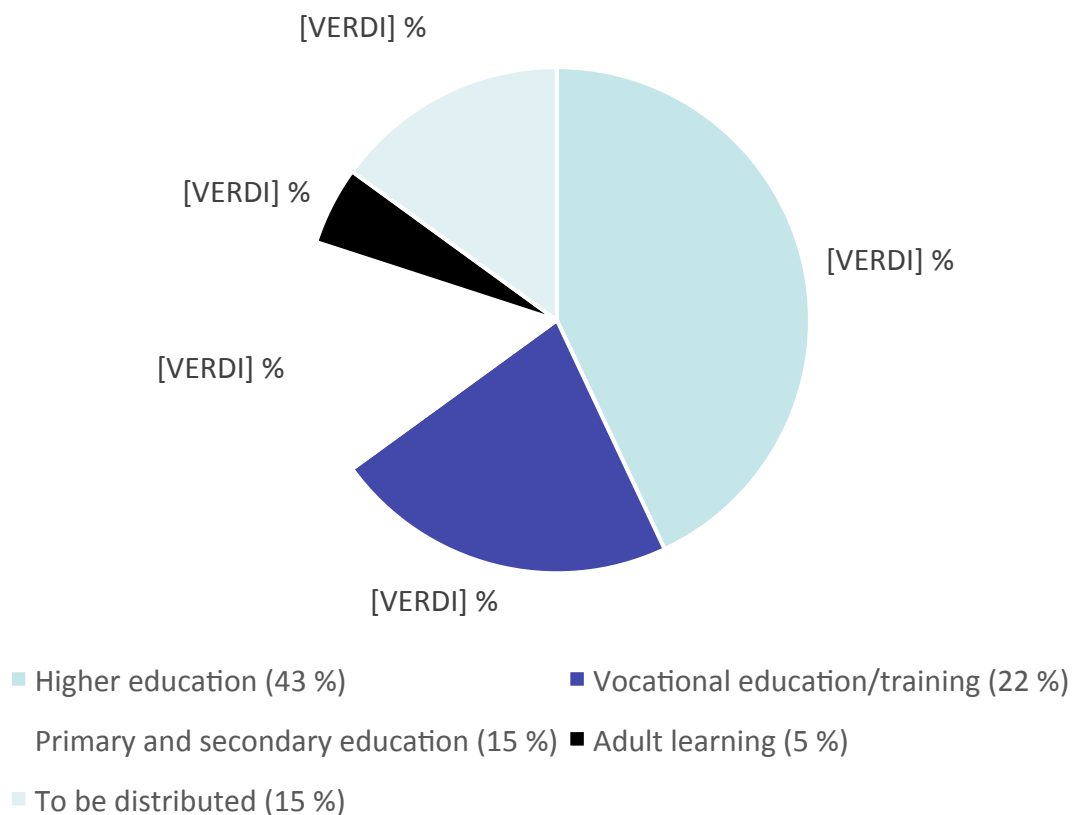
€ 14,7 billion over the period 2014-2020

Erasmus + Supported actions



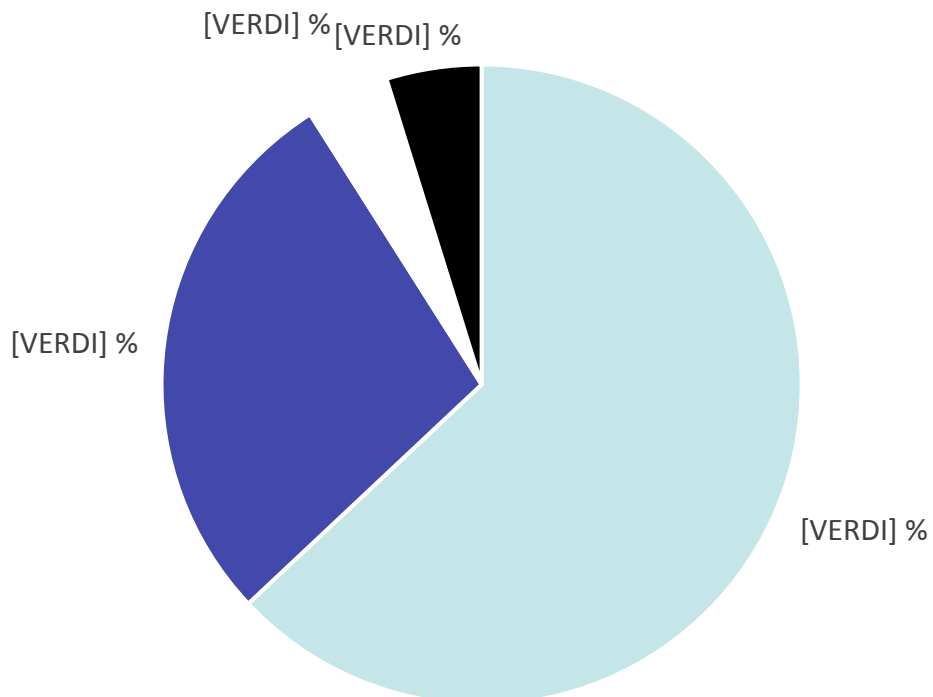
3 Key actions:

KA1: Individual mobility

KA2: Co-operation for innovation and good practices

Budget per key action



■ KA1 (at least 63 %) ■ KA2 (at least 28 %) ■ KA3 (4,2 %) ■ To be distributed between KA1 and KA2 (4,8 %)

KA1 Individual mobility



- Mobility (exchanges) for pupils, apprentices, students and employees – in pre-school, primary and secondary education, vocational education and training, higher education, and for youth (non-formal and informal learning)
 - Courses, seminars etc.
 - (Parts of) apprenticeships
 - Job shadowing, teaching assignments abroad
 - Joint Master Degrees (higher education)

KA1 individual mobility in primary and secondary education



- For teachers, headmasters and other employees in kindergardens/pre-schools, primary schools and secondary schools:
 - Further education abroad:
 - Courses, seminars etc.
 - Job shadowing in a partner institution
 - Teaching assignments in partner institutions in another European country
 - ***Schools/pre-schools/kindergardens (headmaster's office) apply for «mobility projects», 1 or 2 years of durability, possibly entailing several different mobility activities***

KA1 individual mobility for vocational education – pupils/apprentices



- Pupils and apprentices in vocational education and training can spend between 2 weeks and 12 months in another programme country
- In a school or company
- The vocational school/institution – or consortium - applies on behalf of the pupil(s)/apprentice(s)

KA1 individual mobility for vocational education – teachers and employees



For employees in a school or company:

- Courses, seminars, study visits
 - Job shadowing
 - Teaching assignments

- Up to 2 months in another programme country

KA1 individual mobility for higher education



- Mobility for students at all levels and all study programs – up to 12 months
 - Both programme and partner countries (some non-EU countries)
- Joint Degrees (previous Erasmus Mundus programme):
 - Must involve at least 3 institutions from 3 different programme countries
 - Financed through grants
 - 80 % students from outside of Europe
- Loan Guarantee Facility for Master Students

KA1 individual mobility for higher education - employees



- Up to 2 months:
 - Courses, seminars
 - Job shadowing, incl. employees in companies
- Program and partner countries
- All disciplines

KA1 individual mobility for youth



- European Voluntary Service (EVS) – from 2 weeks up to 12 months
- International exchanges (seminars, courses etc.)
- Courses, training and job shadowing for youth workers

KA2 Co-operation for innovation and good practices



- Main idea: To strengthen transnational co-operation between and within sectors
- Strategic partnerships in the field of education, training and youth
- Knowledge alliances: Co-operation between higher education, research and companies
- Sector skills alliances: Co-operation between education institutions and companies
- Capacity building – in the field of higher education and in the field of youth

KA2 – Strategic partnerships



- Open for all types of partners from the public or private sector
- Examples of activities
 - Innovative practices (learning methods, teaching materials, manuals etc.)
 - Co-operation between different sectors (public authorities, civil society, companies etc.)
 - Networking, exchange of experiences
 - Recognition of learning through EU-tools such as Youthpass and Europass
 - Focusing on public participation and social entrepreneurship

KA3 Political reform



- Knowledge development – Studies and analysis, European working groups and networks etc.
- Prospective initiatives – focusing on education systems
- European tools and standards for acknowledging (formal and non-formal) education (EQF, ECTS, ECVET, EQUAVET, Europass, Youthpass etc.)
- Cooperation with other international organisations (OECD, Council of Europe etc.)
- Dialogue and information

New in Erasmus +: Sport



- Co-operation projects which seek to enhance knowledge about the sports sector and which will improve policy development and dialogue
- European sports events (not-for-profit)
- Aims:
 - Deal with major challenges such as drugs, match fixing, violence, discrimination etc within sport
 - Support good practices
 - Promote volunteerism, social inclusion and knowledge about the health advantages of physical activity
- Applications: European commission

Erasmus + application deadlines



- Application deadlines three times a year
- 2014: March 17th, April 30th and October 1st

- Programme is planned to start January 1st 2014
- Programme guide is planned published December 2013

Creative Europe – general objectives



- Fostering the safeguarding and promotion of European cultural and linguistic diversity
- Strengthening the competitiveness of the cultural and creative sectors to promote smart, sustainable and inclusive growth (EU 2020 strategy)

Creative Europe – specific objectives



- Support the capacity of European cultural and creative sectors (CCS) to operate transnationally
 - Promote the transnational circulation of cultural and creative works and operators and reach new audiences in Europe and beyond
 - Strengthen the financial capacity of CCS, in particular SMEs
 - Support transnational policy cooperation in order to foster policy development, innovation, audience building and new business models

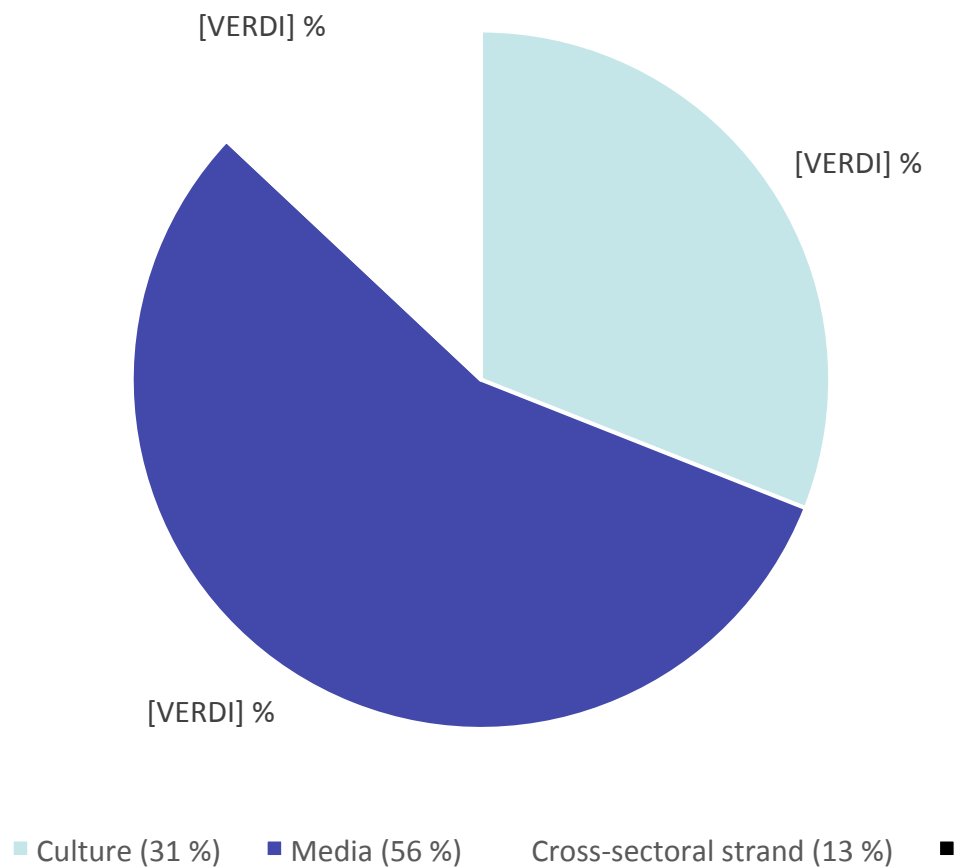

Horizon 2020



- A new integrated financing facility for research and innovation 2014-2020
- Budget: € 80 billion (2011 prices)
- Aims:
 - Answer to the economic crisis – investment in future jobs, and economic growth
 - Connect research and innovation – of all types
 - Focus on major societal challenges (health/aging, transport, clean energy etc.)
 - Coordinate different types of European research efforts
 - Strengthen the global position of Europe within research, innovation and technology

Horizon 2020 - priorities



Three main pillars:

1. Excellent science

2. Industrial leadership

3. Societal challenges:

- Health, democratic change and wellbeing
- Food security, sustainable agriculture, marine and maritime research, bio-based economy
- Secure, clean and efficient energy
- Smart, green and integrated transport
- Climate action, resource efficiency and raw materials
- Inclusive, innovative and secure societies
