

EU Strategy for the Baltic Sea Region

- First macro-regional strategy in the EU out of today three strategies
- Adopted by the European Council of October 2009
- Long-term approach towards the implementation of EU policies in the Baltic Sea region
- Explicitly asks for cooperation and coordination among the Baltic Sea States (MSs and non-EU MSs)

- Latvia's priority fields have been defined:

 - Public safety






Governance system of the EUSBSR



- VASAB and HELCOM are Horizontal Action Leaders
- Encouraging the use of maritime and land-based spatial planning in all member states around the Baltic sea and develop a common approach for cross-border cooperation
- Latvian maritime spatial plan till 2020 according to the EU BSRS
- Maritime strategy = Sea basin strategy by 2020
